1. SIRIM Industry Standards

SIRIM Industry Standards were introduced in 2014 to address the needs of industry for organisation/industry level standards.

SIRIM Industry Standards prescribe the way in which the business or production is to be operated, stipulate required practices in the workplace, and ensure quality of production, materials and outsource services. They help organisations gain a competitive edge, drive down costs, boost productivity and improve profits.

In essence, SIRIM Industry Standards offer an alternative to industries:

- when a national consensus document is not required
- when there is a need for a standard that caters for the specific requirements of an organisation or certain industry sector
- to address gaps not covered by Malaysian Standards



Three categories of SIRIM Industry Standards:

SIRIM Standard:

A standard developed with consensus through representation of relevant sectors that have an interest in its use.

Association Standard:

A standard developed with consensus among companies within an association or professional society, e.g. a trade association that comprises different petroleum companies.

Organisation Standard:

A standard developed by SIRIM for an organisation's proprietary use.

SIRIM Eco Standards

Product Criteria Document (PCD)

A document used in the audit process by SIRIM QAS International Sdn Bhd for its Eco-Labelling Scheme. The Eco-Labelling Mark communicates the product's environmental benefits to consumers.

Product Category Rules (PCR)

A document used in the audit process by SIRIM QAS International Sdn Bhd for its Product Carbon Footprint Certification Scheme. The Product Carbon Footprint Certification Mark granted to the certified products supports the organisation's declarations of reducing greenhouse gas emissions.
